THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Will this Joseph shape the 21st-century American Catholic church?

Last May, Joseph Cardinal Tobin, Archbishop of Newark, greeted some 200 LGBT pilgrims and their families at Sacred Heart Cathedral in Newark by saying, "I am Joseph, your brother." This phrase reminded



me of another famous cardinal named Joseph Bernardin, who months after his appointment as Archbishop of Chicago met with Jewish leaders and uttered those same words. Nearly 35 years ago, building bridges between Jews and Catholics was essential to bring healing after centuries of animosity. Today, Tobin's historic gesture toward the LGBT community, despite pushback from some Catholics and even hierarchs, is just as needed. In so many ways, Tobin and Bernardin are so much alike it's as if Tobin continues the legacy of the other Joseph at a time in our church and country when consensus and compassion are most needed.

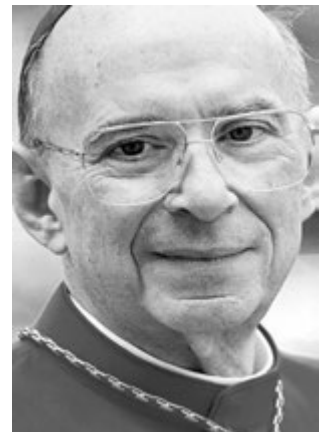
Next Thursday, the Archdiocese of Newark will celebrate Tobin's reception of the pallium by Pope Francis last June. Archbishops receive from the Pope a narrow, circular band of wool placed around the shoulders with short lappets hanging from front and back. It symbolizes the chief role of an archbishop as a shepherd. And that's how we remember Joseph Bernardin, perhaps the most influential American Catholic churchman in the

20th century. He was the youngest bishop in the U.S. in 1966 when he became auxiliary bishop of Atlanta. He became the Archbishop of Chicago in 1982 and a cardinal, the next year. As head of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, he fostered extensive dialogue and consultation that produced two landmark pastoral letters on war and peace and the economy. He coined the phrase, "seamless garment," threading together all the life issues worthy of protection.

An interesting connection between Bernardin and Tobin was John Cardinal Dearden, the Archbishop of Detroit, where Tobin grew up. Dearden attended the Second Vatican Council and was an ardent supporter of church reforms. He tutored Bernardin when he was the USCB general secretary. Tobin grew up under Dearden's leadership though entered the Redemptorists, a religious order, and eventually became their Superior General and lived in Rome since 1991. In 2005 he participated in a Spanish language group with then Jorge Cardinal Bergoglio, now Pope Francis, who was obviously impressed with Tobin, who speaks five languages. He made him a Cardinal in 2016 and moved him to Newark.

Already Tobin has taken some strong stands in support of undocumented immigrants and called Trump's ending of DACA "malicious... Today, the Administration not only has closed borders; it also has closed minds and hearts." He also issued a statement on the racist aftermath of Charlottesville. "Dark words and deeds must be met with light and love." Back in Indiana, he was known to consult widely and was universally loved before he left for N.J. He is currently revamping the priests' council in Newark and plans for an archdiocesan pastoral council. At the June meeting of the U.S. bishops, his strong yet gentle style won over many other bishops and the press. In the *National Catholic Reporter*, Michael Sean Winters wrote, "This year, a star rose in the East, as Cardinal Joseph Tobin of Newark emerged as the prophetic voice of the conference. 'He is genuinely free, profound and holy,' one bishop told me. His interventions were 'unassailable.' "

A towering figure, who can bench press a LeBron James, he is not easily moved. Like Bernardin, Tobin lost his father at an early age. Bernardin had one sister; Tobin had eight and four brothers so he knows how to negotiate. His presence has a healing quality, which has reverberated in the archdiocese since his arrival in January. Someday, people will talk about what Tobin did for the U.S. church in the 21st century like Bernardin in the 20th -- as our brother!

MENSAJE SEMANAL



Se diría que hay veces en las que perdonar y olvidar no llevan muy lejos. ¿Hay que perdonar, de verdad, 490 veces como si nada hubiera ocurrido? La cosa es que se nos pide perdonar y perdonar sin límites y sin cuenta. Es muy difícil, si no imposible, llevar la cuenta de 70 veces 7; pero también

se pide que, por el bien y el amor hacia todos, incluso los que ofenden, se tomen las medidas necesarias para una verdadera corrección y protección. Lo importante en este mensaje de hoy es que la manera en que el “rey”, es decir, Dios, funciona, es muy distinta de nuestra forma de actuar. Dios no parece llevar cuentas y, cuando las lleva, es muy fácil que las olvide. Parece un perdón incondicional; pero sí que existe una condición, y es que las personas perdonadas, perdonen a su vez. Si no lo hacen, pierden la conexión con Dios, rompen en sí mismas la imagen de Dios. Sí estamos hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios, quiere decir que tenemos que reproducir en nosotros mismos las cualidades de Dios; y Dios es todo amor y perdón. Es posible que a veces andemos ciegos a nuestra propia realidad y hayamos justificado nuestras acciones como reacciones lógicas a un mal, o como condicionamientos de nuestra personalidad; y entonces, no seamos capaces de reconocer lo mucho que se nos ha perdonado a nosotros mismos. Sí nos paramos a pensar y empezamos a ver la enorme misericordia que ha tenido Dios para con nosotros, se nos agotan las excusas para no perdonar. Tenemos que caer rendidos, admirados y agradecidos por la increíble bondad de Dios.

Statement of Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark On the Rescission of DACA Executive Order

The decision to phase out the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals executive order is malicious.

It is plainly and clearly wrong for this Administration to use as a political tool the lives, futures and security of some 800,000 young people whose only crime, if you ever could call it that, was that they lovingly and obediently accompanied their parents in pursuit of the dream of freedom and opportunity.

Whether or not the previous administration had authority to institute DACA does not matter. The 800,000 Dreamers affected by the rescission are people. They live in our neighborhoods, attend our schools, fight for our country, and contribute actively in our workplaces. They are contributing to this nation's future and prosperity. They have followed the rules that have been in place, always praying that Congress would step up to the plate and craft intelligent, heartfelt long term solutions to a broken immigration system.

One can't hide behind the term "legality" in rescinding DACA. That is an abandonment of humanity, and abandonment of talented and hopeful young people who are as American as you and I.



The rule of law, first, last and always, must provide a humane, moral code to organize, protect and advance society based on the best ideals and beliefs in our hearts and minds. Catholic teaching calls all people to make a commitment to uphold the dignity of every person and to work for the common good of our nation. Rescinding DACA without having in place through Congress an equivalent and permanent protection for these Americans does not advance society or exemplify our best ideals and beliefs. It is, rather, an abandoning of humanity.
