PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Performing a Wedding and Preparing for a Marriage

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. This celebration of the Mass unites us as Catholics. From this and within it, we celebrate sacramental Baptism, Communion, Confirmation, Ordination and once a year, the Anointing of the Sick. On occasion, we have had a Wedding at a parish Mass. I believe it is important for a person preparing to marry in Our Lady of Grace or St. Joseph worship regularly for a period of time. It is important to cultivate community and become a part of the parish. From this involvement comes the desire to marry here when a parishioner is ready.

From now on, we will not accept a wedding for people who register just to get married here. We expect you will worship for a period of six months before we even set a date for a wedding. I find that some people think that selecting a church is like picking a reception venue. Once you satisfy this requirement, we can set a date one year in advance from that time. We are not a typical parish. We have people who move to Hoboken from all over the country and even world. Some people decide to marry in their home parish or elsewhere and I will not give

permission to anyone who has not worshipped for six months.

In my 13 years here, I have found the most fulfilling weddings of couples or individuals who have made this their parish and come to church regularly, get involved and support the church in a variety of ways through time, talent and treasure. I will not be forced by anyone to set a date for a marriage. If that is what you are looking for, please go elsewhere.

I also feel an obligation to people who live in Hoboken. There are scores of churches within miles of OLG/ St. Joseph. It's not the beauty of the church that should attract you but the desire to build community in this lovely church and making your faith grow.

And that takes me to the last point: a wedding is one day, a marriage is a lifetime. Too many couples and families focus on wedding planners, reception venues, photography, videography and all the overblown and expensive aspects of weddings in this day and age. Without the spiritual and sacramental components, a wedding does not automatically become a marriage. Please share this message with your friends. I pray for all who search. Plan your wedding but make it a true marriage that is steeped in Catholic tradition and the community of faith.

MENSAJE SEMANAL

Casi todo el mundo puede hablar de una experiencia en que se sintió como sus labores fueron “infructíferos;” como trabajo duro no vale la pena. Tal vez, es una cosa pequeña, pero en muchos casos, es algo muy importante a nosotros – el deseo de criar a nuestros hijos en la fe, una relación que estimamos, un plan para nuestra vida con que nos hemos encariñado – en todo esto, podemos sentirnos como Dios es ausente, o como la vida es absurda.

Saco esta tema, porque lo que Jesus dice en el Evangelio de este Domingo, de verdad, habla a esta situación muy común – y sus palabras son buenas noticias para nosotros. “¿Con qué compararemos el Reino de Dios? ¿Con qué parábola lo podremos representar? Es como una semilla de mostaza que, cuando se siembra, es la más pequeña de las semillas; pero una vez sembrada, crece y se convierte en el mayor de los arbustos y echa ramas tan grandes, que los pájaros pueden anidar a su sombra” (Mc 4:30-32).

Asi como una semilla de mostaza, la “más pequeña de las semillas” primeramente es apenas vista, pero crece para convertirse en el mayor de los arbustos, tambien el Reino de Dios, la voluntad de Dios dentro de nosotros, tan frecuentemente, opera en una manera que no podemos verla; tal vez, el Señor opera en una manera en que parezca totalmente ausente – pero eventualmente, su Reino florece en nosotros. Frecuentemente, vivimos vidas de oración, confiamos en el Señor, trabajamos muy duro, y todavía, nuestras vidas parezcan como si no den fruto. Pero podemos tener confianza, que de verdad, es solamente una apariencia – Dios siempre se acerca a nosotros, y trabaja en nuestras vidas para llevarnos a la plenitud de la vida en su Hijo, Jesucristo.

En palabras muy profundas, Bendito Charles de Foucauld lo resume: “Dios nos da consolación y gozo, donde, cuando y como Él quiere. En un momento, Dios puede destruir nuestro sueño de felicidad; en un instante, hace que ‘el desierto florezca como un lirio,’ y convierte ‘la noche en una luz brillante.’”

Transgender and Catholic: A parent's perspective

A deacon's personal account of parenting a transgender child.

Scientists are only just beginning to understand the biological and psychological factors that contribute to gender identity. The only choice that transgender individuals make is whether or not to embrace who they

are and live their lives openly as their authentic selves in the face of the rejection, discrimination, bigotry, and even violence that they know they may have to endure.

When my wife and I were forced to educate ourselves about gender identity issues, we found there was no lack of sound, credible information that only reinforced our personal experience. The American Medical Association, the American Psychological Association, the American Psychiatric Association, and the World Professional Association for Transgender Health, who together represent more than 300,000 doctors, psychiatrists, and psychologists, have each affirmed the reality of transgender individuals and have issued documents opposing all forms of discrimination against them and providing standards of health care for them. The United Nations has actively opposed the discrimination and violence that trans individuals suffer in many parts of the world. Companies and organizations we all do business with every day—from Apple to WalMart—recognize trans individuals with equal employment opportunity policies and inclusive health insurance.

I share the concerns of all parents for the well-being of their children, including their adult children, concerns that are amplified when an LGBT individual is involved. Our prayers and hopes for our daughter are colored by the reality of the discrimination she will likely face for the rest of her life. The probability of being a victim of violence or committing suicide is greater for the LGBT community than for the general population, and even greater for the transgender community in particular. My family is always a bit on edge when we go out together, worried that unfriendly looks and remarks might escalate to a confrontation or violence. Nobody should have to live that way.

I have found that at the end of the day, what transgender individuals want more than anything else is simply to be able to live their lives as who they are, with the same rights, freedom, and dignity that the rest of us enjoy.

My pastoral perspective is informed by the call that all permanent deacons share: to bring the church into the world with all its problems and to bring the problems of the world back to the church.

Well, here's one such problem: The community of faith includes transgender people who are marginalized, unjustly condemned, and suffering simply because of who they are. We as a church need to do some serious self-examination and to take responsibility. I simply cannot believe that our compassionate, loving God wants his children to suffer. I've heard warnings about falling into the sin of trying to replace the creator. Are we guilty of that sin when we look at a transgender person and have the hubris to deny who God has made? I pray that the church will be open to learning and embracing the truth about transgender individuals who have the same inherent value and dignity as all human beings. Perhaps we all need to have a little more humility and a little more faith in who God has created.
